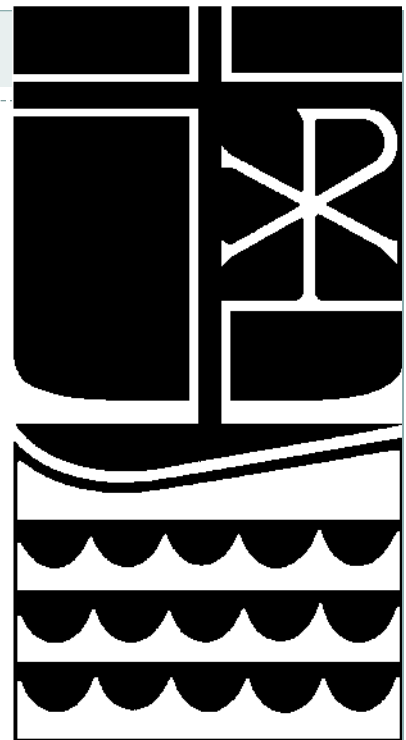

Featured speaker will be Judge Wendell Griffen, judge of the 6th Circuit Court in Arkansas and pastor of New Millenium Church in Little Rock. Judge Griffen is a staunch supporter of equality and a fearless opponent of the death penalty. He will speak about Southern Seminary and its history of race relations. BIBLE BASICS CLASS

For the next few months, the Pastor's Class is studying LPTS Professor Dr. Tyler Mayfield's new book *A Guide to Bible Basics*.

What's actually in the Bible? Where do we find the story of Moses or Jesus's Parable of the Prodigal Son? Who are the main characters in the books of Joshua and Acts? *A Guide to Bible Basics* provides a summary and chapter outline of each biblical book to facilitate comprehension of its fundamental story and subject matter. This accessible and concise book presents the basic content of the Bible with the conviction that readers first need some level of comprehension of the Bible's stories, poetry, regulations, and teachings before addressing theological, historical, and literary concerns for its relevance today. Tyler Mayfield discusses important people, places, and terms so that the reader can quickly see the primary focus. This book can be used alone to help readers in their knowledge of the Bible and is great for beginners or those in need of a refresher course.

Copies of the book are available. The class meets each **Sunday** at 9:30 AM in Room 211 of the Burhans Building and is open to all. Dr. Mayfield will be joining the class on a couple of Sundays.

Cost is \$7.00 per person.

SOCIAL JUSTICE MOVIE

April's Social Justice movie, *Boy Erased*, tells the courageous story of Jared Eamons (Lucas Hedges), the son of a Baptist pastor in a small American town, who must overcome the fallout of being outed to his parents (Nicole Kidman and Russell Crowe). His parents struggle with reconciling their love for their son with their beliefs. Fearing a loss of family, friends, and community, Jared is pressured into attending a conversion therapy program. While there, Jared comes into conflict with its leader (Joel Edgerton)

and begins his journey to finding his own voice and accepting his true self. The 2018 film, nominated for two Golden Globes, is based on the book *Boy Erased: A Memoir of Identity, Faith, and Family* by Garrard Conley. The movie will be shown on **Friday, April 26** at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor (note date change from usual third Friday – due to Holy Week). We plan to compare this film to June's offering, *The Miseducation of Cameron Post*, so you may want to make a special effort to attend both.

READING GROUP

Ready for a good mystery? Join the Reading Group as we discuss Agatha Christie's *Death Comes As the End*. **Dame Agatha Christie transports us back to ancient Egypt 2000 B.C. where a priest's daughter, investigating a suspicious death, uncovers an asp's nest of jealousy, betrayal, and serial murder.** It is Egypt in 2000 BC, where death gives meaning to life. At the foot of a cliff lies the broken, twisted body of Nofret, concubine to a ka-priest. Young, beautiful, and venomous, most agree that it was fate—she deserved to die like a snake! But at her father's house on the banks of the Nile, the priest's daughter Renisenb believes that the woman's death is suspicious. Increasingly, she becomes convinced that the source of evil lurks within their household—and watches helplessly as the family's passions explode in murder. (Amazon.com)
