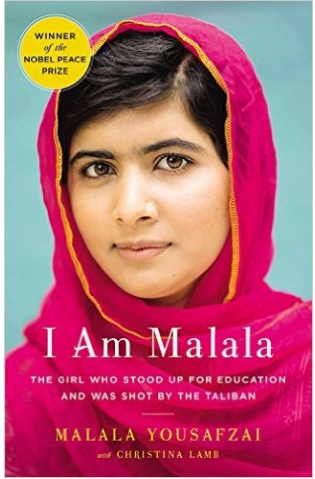

June 22 kicked off our four week **Academic Academy**. About 27 students participated with us Monday – Friday for 4 weeks to work on academic skills so that they are better prepared to begin a new school year. The Academic Academy finished July 17.



Our Academic Academy students showed improvement on post assessments in reading and math. In addition to academic studies, the students also spent time talking about nutrition, phone etiquette, and memorizing important

information like their addresses, phone number and parents’ names. Our students also went on four field trips. We went to Huber Farm and picked blueberries, played putt-putt and ate lunch at Cracker Barrel learning etiquette on dining in restaurants, created glass art projects and painted pottery at The Artist in You, and hiked through Bernheim Forest.



After the Academic Academy wrapped up in July 17th, our 3rd-5th grade students traveled to Crossville, Tennessee for **PassportKids! camp**. July 23-26 we took 23 students and 7 chaperones.
