


Thank you, Thank you

Reading Group

The Reading Group begins the new year with *The Tattooist of Auschwitz*, the 2018 novel by Heather Morris. We will gather to discuss the book on *Thursday*, *January 30* at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor.

This beautiful, illuminating tale of hope and courage is based on interviews that were conducted with Holocaust survivor and Auschwitz-Birkenau tattooist Ludwig (Lale) Sokolov—an unforgettable love story in the midst of atrocity.

In April 1942, Lale Sokolov, a Slovakian Jew, is forcibly transported to the concentration camps at Auschwitz-Birkenau. When his captors discover that he speaks several languages, he is put to work as a *Tätowierer* (the German word for tattooist), tasked with permanently marking his fellow prisoners.

Imprisoned for over two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific A vivid, harrowing, and ultimately hopeful re-creation of Lale Sokolov's experiences as the man who tattooed the arms of thousands of prisoners with what would become one of the most potent symbols of the Holocaust, *The Tattooist of Auschwitz* is also a testament to the endurance of love and humanity under the darkest possible conditions.

Discounted copies of the book are available at Carmichael's — just mention the CHBC Reading Group. Everyone is invited to read and join us for lively discussion and warm fellowship on a cold winter's evening.

Social Justice Movie

The overarching theme of 2020's Social Justice movies is politics as it is an election year. January's selection is Frost/Nixon, the 2008 film retelling of the post-Watergate television interviews between British talkshow host David Frost and former president Richard Nixon. Starring Frank Langella as Nixon and Michael Sheen as Frost, it is based on the 1977 interview to confront the questions of his time in office and the Watergate scandal that ended his presidency.

The movie will be shown *Friday, January* 17 at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor. All are welcome to view the film and join in the discussion following.

Other movies planned for the year include Vice. All the President's Men, The Manchurian Candidate, Election, and others.

CHBC STUDENT MINISTRY 2019 REPORT

In 2019, Crescent Hill Baptist Church accomplished some amazing ministry with students. Here are some of the highlights:

Wednesday Afternoons:

Each week a group of teenagers from around the world gathers in our youth room on Wednesday afternoon. We are American, Karen, Karenni, Chin, Burmese, Congolese, Nepali, Vietnamese, Chinese, and the list continues to grow. Our youth group is a refuge, a place for teenagers to belong, no matter where they come from.

Thank you to Beverly Baker, Michael Smith, Luke Griffin, Rhonda Gilliland and Marlene Schmitz who regularly assisted during Wednesday youth times. We are very grateful for the transportation assistance provided by Allen and Eileen Bartlett in the afternoons, and from Beverly Baker, Josh Bair, Glen Bellou, Adrienne Eisenmenger, Rhonda Gilliland, Margaret Graves, Ellen Massey, and Frank Woggon in the evenings. Additional assistance is needed from 3:30-5:15 to supervise our youth areas.

Sunday Mornings:

This year we have studied the Bible together, fellowshipped over breakfast, heard from special guests, and led in worship. We had after-church fellowships, marked transitions into middle school, high school, and college with gift Bibles and journals. We continue to have a great group of teachers including Carolyn Arnett, John Arnett, and Tim Baker.

CBFKY Missions Weekend:

We joined other youth groups at Georgetown College for a weekend of worship, Bible study, mission projects and fellowships. It was a great time of service, connection and growth for CBF youth from across the state. Youth served in homeless shelters, soup kitchens, habitat houses, community gardens and Quest Farm. Allen Bartlett assisted us with transportation.

Youth Passport:

Youth travelled to Gordon College in Wenham, MA this summer. Four of our youth were named "Honor Campers", based on their actions and attitude on the mission sites. We also won the camp volleyball tournament, defeating all other youth teams and the Passport staff.

On the way to camp, we viewed the U.S. side of Niagara Falls and worshipped with a congregation of American and Karen Baptists in Utica, NY. On our free day, teenagers born in the U.S., Thailand, and the Congo played together in the chilly Atlantic Ocean and went on a ghost tour in Salem. On our way home, they stood together in the summer heat beneath the Statue of Liberty and searched for whales in Boston Harbor. These amazing experiences bookended a week spent in service projects, Bible studies, worship, and fellowship with other Christian youth through Passport Missions. One of our seniors described the trip as "the best Passport ever". Our youth will carry these life changing experiences with them for the rest of their lives.

Youth parents were aided in making this possible for our youth by the fundraising efforts of during St. Joe's Picnic and other events, as well as the generosity of CHBC donors, donations from our Karen members, and scholarships from the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship that are available only to churches supporting CBF Field Personnel. We are exceedingly grateful for our chaperones and drivers, Allen Bartlett, Glen Bellou, Josh Bair, Millie Horn, Moo Rah Soe, and Kle Thu Po.

Ministry Coordination

Dr. Donyelle McCray, Assistant Professor of Homiletics, Yale Divinity School

Dr. Donyelle McCray studies homiletics and Christian spirituality, focusing on African American preaching, sermon genre, and modes of authority. In her work, the sermon occupies the shoreline between sacred and profane speech



and holds emancipatory potential within Christian liturgies and beyond them. She writes about the ways African American women and lay people use the sermon to play, remember, invent, and disrupt. Her recent book, *The Censored Pulpit: Julian of Norwich as Preacher*, offers a homiletical reading of Julian's life and ministry and attends to the relationship between preaching, embodiment, and authority. Her current research examines the preaching and spirituality of the Rev. Dr. Pauli Murray. She is also working on a documentary film as part of the Louisville Institute's Clergy-Scholar Research team on Race, Church, and Theological Practices.

2020 William M. Johnson Lecture—March 29-30, 2020



This year's lecturer will be **Dr. Molly T. Marshall,** President and Professor of Theology and Spiritual Formation, Central Baptist Theological Seminary. Dr. Marshall will present a lecture on *Saturday, March 29* and will bring the sermon in morning worship *Sunday, March 30*.

Molly T. Marshall's great passion in life is preparing women and men for ministry excellence. "I love to witness what transpires in the lives of students as they engage the great intellectual heritage of the church. I love even more when they discover their depth of giftedness and begin to sow seeds of hope in the congregations where they practice their craft."

During her tenure as president, Central Seminary has moved the campus to a new location, opened multiple extension sites, constructed a partnership with Myanmar

Institute of Theology, developed a Korean Studies program, launched a Women's Leadership Initiative, and found new ways to focus the seminary's mission in congregational health and global Christianity.

Previously, Dr. Marshall was Associate Professor of Theology at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. During part of her time at Southern, Molly was a member of Crescent Hill Baptist. Her experience in ministry is varied. She has served as youth minister, campus minister, and pastor in churches across Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas, and Kentucky. She has written three monographs as well as numerous chapters in books, dictionary and journal articles, and Bible study curricula. She has also published six volumes of *Trinitarian Soundings*, a collection of reflections on the lectionary. Currently she is writing a commentary on Thessalonians for the BELIEF series.
