READING GROUP

The Reading Group begins the new year with *The Tattooist of Auschwitz*, the 2018 novel by Heather Morris. We will gather to discuss the book on **Thursday, January 30** at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor.

This beautiful, illuminating tale of hope and courage under the darkest possible conditions is based on interviews that were conducted with Holocaust survivor and Auschwitz-Birkenau tattooist Ludwig (Lale) Sokolov—an unforgettable love story in the midst of atrocity. In April 1942, Lale Sokolov, a Slovakian Jew, is forcibly transported to the concentration camps at Auschwitz-Birkenau. When his captors discover that he speaks several languages, he is put to work as a *Tätowierer* (the German word for tattooist), tasked with permanently marking his fellow prisoners. Imprisoned for over two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific atrocities and barbarism—but also incredible acts of bravery and compassion. Discounted copies of the book are available at Carmichael's — just mention the CHBC Reading Group. Everyone is invited to read and join us for lively discussion and warm fellowship on a cold winter's evening.

SOCIAL JUSTICE MOVIE
