READING GROUP

The Reading Group begins the new year with *The Tattooist of Auschwitz*, the 2018 novel by Heather Morris. We will gather to discuss the book on **Thursday, January 30** at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor.

The book is based on interviews that were conducted with Holocaust survivor and Auschwitz-Birkenau tattooist Ludwig (Lale) Sokolov. When his captors discover that he speaks several languages, he is put to work as a *Tätowierer* (the German word for tattooist), tasked with permanently marking his fellow prisoners. Imprisoned for over two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific atrocities and barbarism—but also incredible acts of bravery and compassion. Everyone is invited to read and join us for lively discussion and warm fellowship on a cold winter's evening.
