STATE ELECTIONS ON NOVEMBER 5 - BE READY!

Recently Representative John Yarmuth commented that currently the "states" are where things are happening and important laws are being made. State elections have significant influences on what does and can happen on the National level. Several main state positions are being elected: governor, attorney general, and secretary of state.

Every citizen needs to vote in November. So, if you are not registered to vote, you must **sign up by October 7, 2019. Here is who can register:**

1. **Anyone who is a US citizen over the age of 18.**
2. **If you registered once, you do not need to register again.**
3. **But, if you moved since you registered, you must turn in a change of address so you will go to the right place to vote.**

Crescent Hill Baptist Church will be helping people register on Sundays beginning **September 15**. Look for the registration tables! It is easy. All you need is:

1. **Your Social Security number.**
2. **The address where you now live.**
3. **If you want to be a republican or a democrat.**
