SOCIAL JUSTICE MOVIE

All are welcome to join the group on **Friday, November 15** in the Parlor at 7:00 PM to view and discuss the 2017 drama “Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Montana.” Starring Frances McDormand, Woody Harrelson and Sam Rockwell, it tells the story of Mildred Hayes, a hard-nosed mother who is seeking justice for her murdered daughter. With no arrests after seven months, Mildred puts up three roadside signs to goad Ebbing police chief into action. But the law - and especially Sam Rockwell's hot-headed deputy - don't take kindly to the provocation. And the townsfolk are on their side. But Mildred doesn't care about ruffling a few feathers. In fact, she's happy to pluck *the whole bird*.
