SOCIAL JUSTICE MOVIE

The selection for **Friday, July 19** is Ingmar Bergman's 1962 classic film "Winter Light." This is a quiet, beautifully staged and photographed story of one Sunday afternoon in the life of a Lutheran pastor, his mistress, and his congregants. Still grieving the death of his beloved wife, sick, and having arrived at middle-aged burn-out, the pastor feels his faith has gone and his calling, a sham. The cinematography—literally, the use of winter light—is exquisite. None of Bergman's films offers MGM musical merriment; be prepared for depression that finally, however, does not topple into utter despair. Everyone is invited to view and discuss the film at 7:00 PM in the Church Parlor.
